## From someone who was there ...

Four of us got to Capitol Hill around 10 this morning [1-6-2021] then started the walk to the White House to hear the president's speech and see how many were coming to town for the rally and get good footage. There was a very small group rallying in the back of the Capitol. We had been told there were about a dozen different rallies. All had different speakers, etc, and went by different names. For us, it was about location. Since we parked on the Hill on the Senate side, we wanted to end up there.

It took about 40 minutes to walk from the Capitol to the White House and the entire way it was packed with fun, energizing, polite, fellow Americans carrying American flags, "Don't Tread on Me" flags, and various other signs that signified they were convinced the election had been stolen from the president. We saw police hanging out on corners. We smiled and waved and thanked them for their service when we got close enough. We saw a group of about 4 national guard who were talking with one crowd. We gave them a similar welcome and thank you.

As we got closer to the White House, the street was packed from the African American Museum to the hill around the Washington Monument, all the way to the closest you could get to the White House. The president was about 45 minutes late in speaking. We stayed for about 20 minutes because we were having a hard time hearing. He said something about seeing everyone on the Hill after his speech.

Everyone had planned to go back up there anyway because several of the rallies were going to be in that general direction. We started the walk back up to the Hill thinking we could get some good photos of him speaking, and hear it better. Well, pretty much everyone else was thinking the same thing as this group, on the edge of the large group, started heading back to the Capitol. There was excitement in the air as people hurried up Constitution Ave. to come in through the large wide walkway to the steps of the Capitol.

I was hurrying to get great shots and saw a fence down, next to that big sidewalk. There were no police ... not one at that entrance. I thought it was odd that they were allowing people to just come onto the lawn and walk over barriers. I was really thinking someone would tell us to go in another area like they always do on the hill. You can't just roam around like this without five people yelling at you.

It was as though everyone was being encouraged to run to the stage and get a good space to hear the upcoming speech. It was hard to keep up with them as they ran to the front, but I ran alongside, on the grass, getting some great motion shots. There was not a feeling that they were breaking the law or anything, it was more that they were told there was free pizza at the steps of the Capitol. And that was where everyone stopped because it was the end of the line ... too bad there was no pizza ... we were hungry.

This is when I overheard a man on a phone talking about almost being ready for a "coded" move. I glanced at him and he turned his back. The four of us just kept moving as close as we could ... getting great shots. Everyone was talking about Trump saying he was going to be coming to the Capitol .... to speak? We weren't sure, but we knew with all those people there was no way they would be able to get through the crowd. But, it looked like a podium was ready for a speaker, so maybe he was coming. I was just focused on some really great shots.

The crowd grew thicker, but was still the same group of happy warriors ... singing songs, chanting, USA, etc. That is when the individually dressed, 12 military type people went over the short wall right next to us on the command of someone who was with them. I didn't see it happen but it fit with what I had heard at the bottom of the hill. It was about then that the flashbangs started. We were shocked since there was no violence at all. We were yelling at them to stop doing it ... it really hurt your ears.

They kept shooting them, some with the same ear-piercing persistence. Then when we saw a green plum of smoke we were convinced it was tear gas and decided to leave. Two of us immediately had scratchy throats but thankfully didn't have eye issues.

We walked about ten minutes to the building we were staging out of and all you see on TV is that the Capitol has been breached, guns have been drawn by the secret service, people are forced on the ground ... all incidents had wonderful photos of each event. Why was a photographer allowed to be breaching the Capitol but not two thugs? How did they get into a secure building that makes everyone practically strip to get in, especially carrying flag poles, backpacks, etc. You can't carry things like that into the rotunda, yet, there was a line of people peacefully walking through the rotunda with all these elements?

I don't see how that happened the way it is shown. Again ... I make movies and understand how easy it is to stage anything you want people to believe. First big thing ... there was NO press out there, just tens of thousands of people with their cell phones. There were people like me with a larger camera ... but the video of this skirmish looks too choreographed. Where did those agitators come from, unless they were the twelve we saw climb over that wall and head in that direction, making their way through the crowd, toward the front where the flashbangs were coming from.

There are only two choices as to who infiltrated the peaceful rally and committed violence in order to give a black eye to a group of mainstream Americans who came from all over the country to express their opposition to a fraudulent election. One is that Antifa and BLM, who said they were going to do this ... infiltrated so no one would know they were Antifa or BLM.

But the most logical explanation is that it was professionals who were ordered to infiltrate in order to control the debate, turn the tables on Trump supporters to make them look like radical anarchists, oh, like Antifa and BLM ... two groups that have gotten a "buy" all year as far as their violent rioting.

If they can condemn and marginalize all Trump supporters and constitutionalists, while pinning the label of "anarchist" on this group instead of BLM and Antifa then they win.


